Sheets and Blankets: Remember BFTS requires that all children have a sheet and blanket daily. I have noticed that some children's blanket are too small. The children should be able to cover themselves up completely and they should be a little heavier than the ones they use in the summer months. If you have questions please ask your child's teacher or Ms. Brenda.

Sick Children: If you are called to pick your child up due to a temp of 101° or more your child can not return to the center for at least 24 hours. Even if you get your child home and your child no longer has a temp he or she must be out for the specified amount of time. Please know that we would not call you if your child did not have a temp.

Morning Drop Off: We ask that all children are dropped off no later than 9:30am. Remember all children must be escorted to their room. Parents please adhere to this request. It really throws the class room schedules off and staffing when you bring your child in late consistently. Please remember that when you drop off it is very difficult for the teachers to chat with you because they are trying to take care of all of the children. If you need to make an appointment to talk to your child's teacher by all means please do so.

CAUTION: Because we have children with alleraies do not allow your child to bring any outside food or drinks into the classroom.

Tuition: Payments are due on Monday of each week. There is a \$50.00 late payment if you pay after close of business on Wednesday. This is still true even if you are on vacation. Please take care of tuition before you leave so that you do not incur a late charge. We will also have a small tuition increase of \$3.00 per week starting in January 2018.

Thoughts: I want to take this time to say thank you to all of the parents of Woodlawn. I wake up every morning thanking God for giving me the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of your children. I look forward to continuing to serve you all and the Lord next year!


