Woodlawn United Methodist Church to mark 50 years with special cantata



Woodlawn United Methodist Church is celebrating 50 years at its current location with a cantata this Sunday, Dec. 17, 2017 followed by a cake and punch reception. Breath of Heaven, under the direction of Phillip Streetman, will be the featured music sung by the church's choir. "Phillip has done a good job with it," said the Rev. Jan Oglesbee, who took over as pastor of Woodlawn in July. As part of the celebration, copies of the bulletin from the first church service at the current location will be given to those attending. The Walton Way and Milledge Road site is the third address for the church that began in 1889 as a Sunday school mission endorsed by officials from both St. John United Methodist Church and St. James United Methodist Church, according to a written church history. In 1899, the first structure was built in the Woodlawn neighborhood and located on Pope Avenue. By 1910, the congregation had grown, and a second move took place into the Frog Hollow neighborhood. According to a 1999 article in The Augusta Chronicle,

Frog Hollow was bounded by 13th and 15th streets, Walton Way and Harper Street. From 1863 to 1968, most of the people who lived in Frog Hollow worked for the mills or the city of Augusta. John and Charlotte Silcox subdivided part of the land into residential lots in 1863. One of the streets bore the Silcox name, and Woodlawn's second building was located at the corner of 15th and Silcox streets. Augusta's urban renewal projects of the 1960s led to the third and final move for the congregants. In 1962, Richmond County voters approved a \$5 million bond to begin construction of University Hospital. The last resident moved out of Frog Hollow in 1968, according to the 1999 article in The Chronicle. Woodlawn's current location cost more than \$500,000 to construct and was opened in December 1967. The sanctuary is constructed in the round. An Austin pipe organ purchased in honor of those members who served during World War II was brought to the current location, as were stained glass windows from the former building. The stained glass windows are located in the chapel. Oglesbee said cornerstones from previous buildings are in the church courtyard. Forty-five years after being displaced by the construction of University Hospital, the church opened its arms to the children being served at the University Child Development Center, which the hospital closed. It caused a zoning battle

children being served at the University Child Development Center, which the hospital closed. It caused a zoning battle with the Summerville Neighborhood Association, but the preschool won out. Woodlawn Preschool and Child Development Center has about 93 children in it, according to Oglesbee.

(The VA Hospital is actually on the original Church site.)
