### Larry's Pumpkin Pie Recipe

Cut 1 firm, unblemished pie pumpkin in 1/2 & place on cookie sheet. Bake in a covered oven dish with small amount of water 60-90 min. at 350 or until soft. \*Easy way, place in a covered bowl with 2 in. of water & microwave on high for 15 min or until soft. Remove insides from the skin with a spoon. Place in a blender & create a smooth puree. 3 cups of the pumpkin puree in a mixing bowl & add 1 cup sugar, 4 lg. eggs, & blend until smooth. Mix in 1 can (12 ounces) of evaporated milk slowly, then add 1 & 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon, 1 tsp ground cloves, 1 tsp ground allspice, 1/2 tsp ground ginger, & 1/2 tsp salt. \*Easy way, you can use 4 tsp of pumpkin pie spice instead. The mixture will be runny. Place a 9 in. deep dish pie shell on the rack & pour in mixture until within 1/4 in. of the top. Bake 450 for 15 min, then reduce to 350 for 40-55 min. or until a knife tip comes out clean. Cool and serve!
