This Christmas, Woodlawn UMC had the opportunity to help a family celebrate Christmas by providing the food items for Christmas dinner, and a few gifts for the children.

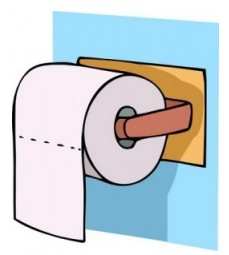

Be Starstruck Over The Christ Child

"After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one born King of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."

The season of Epiphany crowns the Christmas season and completes the rich tapestry that makes the story of the coming of The Christ so unforgettable. Epiphany illuminates the role of the Magi and encourages us to not allow the power of their story to be diminished by our ignoring the scriptural record and insisting that they are a part of the tableau of the nativity.

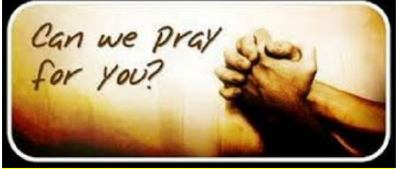
Matthew presents their story not in the context of the manger, but the home of the Holy Family: "When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage."

Often referred to as "kings" themselves, these wise ones were most likely early scientists of the stars, believing that the heavens contained signs of the births of those who would impact daily life. "Starstruck" as they were, they would have had no notion of the King of Kings the celestial phenomenon would eventually lead them to.
