Monday - May 30th - Woodlawn will be <u>CLOSED</u> in observance of Memorial Day





THE TIDINGS

Woodlawn United Methodist

Like it or not, we are soon approaching our third journey into the season of Lent while living through "dare I say it" an unprecedented pandemic. I was making preparations for an Ash Wednesday Service in March 2020 when official word came for the "stay at home" quarantines that would isolate us from one another and prevent us from gathering in our sacred spaces. In many ways, our journey since then has been an ongoing Lenten one. Even though the formal quarantines have dissipated, we remain tried and tested in this seemingly never-ending wilderness and now we are back to the Shakespearean dilemma, "To mask or not to mask..."

Our desire and drive to return to "normalcy" finds us if we are honest, at odds with the spirituality at the heart of Lent. It reminds me of an experience I had the weekend after 9/11 as a spiritual director for retreat. Gathering our leadership team in preparation for the arrival of the participants when the discussion turned to how we should address what happened earlier in the week, one of our leadership team insisted "we won't go there and we should change the subject if it comes up." To which I replied then I must exit this experience now. I could not possibly ignore or deny that 2,977 people had perished that fateful day, nor would I encourage others to do so.

Our days in the wilderness that Lent beckons us to, do not allow us to "retreat" from the realities around us, anymore that Jesus could "retreat" from his own temptations. In a fascinating piece found on the front page of Last Monday's The New York Times, "Writers Wonder If People Want To Curl Up With A Pandemic Novel," countless contemporary writers testify to the dilemma they now find themselves in, "to go there or not to go there." The journalist goes on to report, "The pandemic is also presenting new narratives and artistic pitfalls. Some writers worry a pandemic plot might drive away readers who want to escape our grim reality, but ignoring it might feel jarringly unrealistic."

The topography of the wilderness Jesus found himself in was not only barren but rocky. The Gospel of Luke records that as Jesus is tempted there by Satan, "He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry. The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread' to which Jesus replies 'It is written, One does not live by bread alone." Jesus refuses to deny the reality of his own hunger and prefers letting the rocks be rocks and dwelling amongst their hard edges rather than embracing Satan's illusions.

Our own wilderness days will not allow us to deny our brokenness and fears. World War I loomed so strongly in my grandmother's generational experiences, that she only spoke on rare occasions of the Spanish Flu of 1918 that took the lives of her siblings. John M. Barry's monumental book *The Great Influenza* published in 2005, dared breech the subject of an influenza that had taken lives of an estimated 50 to 100 million people. But "Going there" for us is unavoidable. As much as we would like deny the potency of our own narratives, the pandemic can't be viewed as a "plot problem" to be glossed over anymore than the cross that looms on the other side of the wilderness can be erased.

Oh and by the way, meet me and area clergy in the Augusta Commons, 836 Reynolds Street, for Ash Wednesday and The Imposition of Ashes on March 2nd, from 7:30am - 4:00pm or in our sanctuary at 6:00pm
